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DAY BY DAY ROMANS 14:5-6

For Christians, especially Gentiles, the idea of a "weekend" was not a part of their world until the later Roman Empire when Christianity triumphed over the Empire and established Sunday as a day of worship. Jewish people celebrated the Sabbath from sundown Friday to sundown Saturday. But this was only observed by Jewish Christians. Sunday, however, was the accepted Christian day of worship.

This required that Christians meet early in the morning before working hours or in the evening following work on Sunday. Romans 14:5-6 points out this reality. Jewish Christians were trying to convince Gentiles to observe the Sabbath, even though the Roman government did not recognize Sabbath observance except in the case of Jewish people.

ROMANS 14:5-6

- 5 One person esteems one day above another; another esteems every day alike. Let each be fully convinced in his own mind.
- 6 He who observes the day, observes it to the Lord; and he who does not observe the day, to the Lord he does not observe it. He who eats, eats to the Lord, for he gives God thanks; and he who does not eat, to the Lord he does not eat, and gives God thanks.

The letter of Colossians was written sometime during Paul's 1st imprisonment either in Palestine or Rome. Between the years Of 56-60. Timothy probably served as the secretary for the letter. It was sent to the least important church in Asia Minor. The city of Colossae had by the 1st century shrunk to a small unimportant town. Epaphrus, who is mentioned 2 times in this letter is from there and is a disciple of Paul who is with him during his imprisonment. Paul indicates that the church in Colossae was founded by Epaphrus. Some of Paul's most important theological work is done in this book. Like with Romans Paul did not have a direct connection with this church, so he seems to spend more time on doctrine rather than on personal or church matters.

Ictineo II launched in October of 1864, refitted with a steam generation system in 1867 it became the first powered Submarine. Built by Narcís Monturiol

Submarines were originally built in 1620 in England during the reign of King James I by Dutch engineer Cornelis Drebbel. It was not until 1800 that the 1st successful submarine, the Nautilus, by inventor Robert Fulton was launched. It was the first submarine to move effectively underwater using a screw propulsion driven by manual peddles. The Ictineo II was the first Submarine to use an engine to power the screw. It was a stem engine heated by a chemical reaction of Peroxide which cause the water in the engine to boil. This had the added advantage of releasing Oxygen as a biproduct.

The first successful military use of a submarine was in Charlston harbor 1864 when the H. L. Huntley attached a mine to the Union blockade ship Housatonic. The explosion caused the sinking of both vessels in Charleston harbor, this Submarine was discovered intact in 1970 and raised in 2000. National Submarine Day!

Painting of the H.L. Hunley by Conrad Chapman, completed in 1864 shortly after its first and only mission. It sank the Union blockade ship Housatonic. It went down at the same time with is crew of 8 in Charleston harbor. It was recovered in 2000.



Cary Grant in 1958 had just completed the movie "Houseboat" with Sophia Loren. It had been a difficult set because of a broken romantic liaison between Grant and Loren. Cary Grant and his 3rd wife Betsey Drake were having problems characteristic of most of Grant's marriage relationships. In an attempt to to deal with his problems Betsey recommended that he see Dr. Mortimer Hartman for LSD therapy to get to the root of his depression. By 1959 when the movie was released Grant had become a proponent of LSD therapy.



In 1966 the Beatles released the song "Yellow Submarine". Written by Paul Macartney with John Lennon as a children's song to spotlight Ringo Starr as soloist. Almost immediately it was popular and interpreted in various ways in the pop culture of the 1960s. It was used by anti-war protesters, the "psychedelic culture" that was experimenting with hallucinogenic drugs.

It is believed that some of the lyrics refer to the 1959 movie "Operation Petticoat" during which Cary Grant was beginning his experimentation with LSD.

Film poster from 1968 for the movie "Yellow Submarine




Actress Dyan Cannon began an affair with Grant in 1962 when his divorce was finalizing. They married in 1965 and divorced in 1968

Cary Grant in an LIFE article in 1960 touted the benefits of LSD therapy for solving his relationship problems. He divorced Betsey Drake in 1962 and began an affair with Dyan Canon. They would have a daughter Jennifer in 1966, Grant's only child. Their marriage ended in 1968 due to Cary Grant's pressure on Dyan Cannon to do LSD with him. She had very negative experiences with LSD unlike Cary Grant's.

His article in LIFE inspired the writer Timothy O'Leary to promote the recreational use of LSD. Many performers like the Beatles took psychotropic drugs during this period. Some dramatic suicides under the influence of LSD soured the public perception.

Scrabble Day is on Tuesday of this week. The Game was developed by Alfred Butts in 1933. He was an out of work architect who had an interest in statistics. He decided to attempt creating crossword type game of chance based on letter frequency. The original game was not named "scrabble". Though it was essentially like the modern game. He was unsuccessful in his attempt to sell the game to major game manufacturers. He began making individual sets to sell to friends and neighbors. In the 1940s he met James Burnot who was a fascinated by the game.

He worked out a deal for exclusive marketing rights in 1948 for the game and began producing it with his wife's help. He changed the board slightly to make it play better and changed the name to "Scrabble" a word meaning "to collect intensely". He and his wife lost over 450 dollars on the game in 1949 selling only 2000 games. After a vacation in 1951 they returned to their home to find orders far beyond their ability to supply. Macy's Department store came across the game and wanted a supply for their stores. By 1952 it was being rationed at retail outlets across the USA because it could not be produced fast enough. 3 in five USA households have Scabble.


Edward Nairne ran a stationary shop in England in 1770. He was an inventor and entrepreneur. By accident in 1770 he picked up a piece of "elastic gum" which had recently been introduced in Europe from Central America.

Most of the time to erase pencil marks on paper a piece of stale bread was used. But he picked up the shop owner and inventor [here with chuck of elastic gum by mistake and found it worked far better. By the mid 1770s the elastic gum had been dubbed "rubber" because it was used to "rub out" pencil marks. Improvements in rubber erasers have continued since then. National Rubber Eraser day is Thursday. 2 Corinthians 4:7-10
