As we move into the final months of this very troubling year there is a need to prepare ourselves for anything. Psalm 46 will be our guide. This psalm is one of 10 [possibly 11] psalms written by a group of Levites called the "Sons of Korah". Their ancient ancestor is mentioned in Numbers 16 as the Levitical leader of a revolt against Moses.

In the introduction for Psalm 46, the Psalm in Hebrew is identified as "A Psalm of the sons of Korah, a song for virgins..." Likely the Hebrew word "alamoth" [means young virgin woman] in this circumstance, likely, is being used as a musical notation indicating that this Psalm was written to be sung by sopranos. When it was translated into Greek in the centuries prior to Jesus the translators struggled with the meaning of this statement for they translated it: "For the end, for the sons of Core; a Psalm concerning secret things."




Message: "When God is in Control." Psalm 46:5-6

Probably the reason that this was written for sopranos is found in verses 5-6. Jerusalem is described as a woman set upon by circumstances. She is at the edge of her resolve when God steps in to defend her.

Isaiah would picture Jerusalem as a virgin who would shake her head and laugh in triumph behind the back of her enemies the Assyrians. Such an image was common metaphor in ancient literature.

Jeremiah would also picture Israel, Judah and Jerusalem as virgins set upon by the nations. We do not know when this Psalm was written. It may well date to the time of king Hezekiah and Isaiah.

Isaiah 37:21-23

21 Then Isaiah the son of Amoz sent to Hezekiah, saying, "Thus says the LORD God of Israel, 'Because you have prayed to Me against Sennacherib king of Assyria, 22 'this is the word which the LORD has spoken concerning him: "The virgin, the daughter of Zion, Has despised you, laughed you to scorn; The daughter of Jerusalem Has shaken her head behind your back! 23 "Whom have you reproached and blasphemed? Against whom have you raised your voice, And lifted up your eyes on high? Against the Holy One of Israel.

Ptolemy I Soter [305-282 BC] and Seleucus I Nicator [305-281 BC] were both generals in Alexander The Great's army. They were at times allies and later bitter rivals. They would both carve out kingdoms from Alexander the Great's conquests. Ptolemy would establish a dynasty that would rule Egypt and Libya for nearly 300 years. Seleucus would carve out Syria and most of Asia Minor. Ptolemy's last descendent to reign over Egypt was Cleopatra. Seleucus VII would be the last of the Seleucid dynasty. Antiochus IV would be the last powerful emperor of the Seleucid rulers. Surprisingly the Romans would take possession of both kingdoms in a period of just over 20 years.

These two powerful Greek dynasties would be in almost continual conflict during the centuries that passed. The Jewish people were sandwiched between these 2 kingdoms. Often, they were used as political pawns in the struggle. Sometimes they were able to play off the kingdoms gaining for themselves relative independence. This is the era when the Old Testament was translated into Greek. We now call this translation the Septuagint. It took many generations to translate. Clearly in the translation of this Psalm the political realities of the time affected the translation and application of the Psalm.

They lived in an era of espionage, feints and conspiracies. The Greek version of this psalm seems to reflect this world.

Isaiah 8:11-15

11 For the LORD spoke thus to me with a strong hand, and instructed me that I should not walk in the way of this people, saying: 12 "Do not say, 'A conspiracy,' Concerning all that this people call a conspiracy, Nor be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled. 13 The LORD of hosts, Him you shall hallow; Let Him be your fear, And let Him be your dread. 14 He will be as a sanctuary, But a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense To both the houses of Israel, As a trap and a snare to the inhabitants of Jerusalem. 15 And many among them shall stumble; They shall fall and be broken, Be snared and taken."

We all see things through the lens of our present experience. The translators saw the words at the beginning of this psalm through the lens of their experience. Trepidation characterized living in Palestine in the era prior to Roman occupation, when the Greek kingdoms [Egyptian Ptolemies & Syrian Seleucids] embroiled the Jewish people in their political wrangling. These circumstances undoubtedly affected the way these translators interpreted the meaning of the word "alamoth". It had already accrued "prophetic and eschatological" importance because of Isaiah and Jeremiah's use of the word.

After the invasion of Iraq, a conspiracy theory sprang up that blames the destruction of the Twin Towers of controlled explosions set off by the CIA or other nefarious actors within the Federal government to facilitate a war with Iraq. No matter how you may feel about the war in Iraq of are skeptical of our government there is absolutely no proof that such a conspiracy ever existed. Isaiah warns us that when we are feeling stressed out it is easy to clutch at explanations that are far afield. Certainly conspiracies do exist but as Chuck Colson indicated conspiracies tend to fall apart quickly due to the self-interests and greed of the participants.

Matthew 18:14-20

14 "Even so it is not the will of your Father who is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish.

15 "Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. 16 But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.' 17 And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church.
